How to save a life: seeking orders for health care for de- tained asylum seekers

Geoffrey Watson SC is a barrister at New Chambers, who has undertaken pro bono work in obtaining orders for detainees requiring medical treatment.

Associate Professor Munjed Al Muderis MB ChB FRACS, FAOrthA, is an orthopaedic surgeon, an Adjunct Clinical Associate Professor in the School of Medicine, Sydney Campus at the University of Notre Dame Australia, Honorary Associate of the School of AMME/Faculty of Engineering and IT, the University of Sydney and Clinical Associate Professor at Macquarie University and The Australian School of Advanced Medicine. In addition, Professor Al Muderis refused a decree by Saddam Hussein to amputate the ears of Iraqi draft evaders, and wound up on a rickety boat to Australia. He has experienced immigration detention first hand as detainee 982 in Curtin Detention Centre.

Dr Barri Phatarfod MB BS graduated from Monash University, Victoria in 1988, has been in general practice for 25 years and is the President of Doctors for Refugees which was formed through the AMA Council of General Practice.
