Dr Andrew Ellis is the Chair of Advanced Training in Forensic Psychiatry for the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists, and Director of Training for the NSW Forensic Mental Health Network. His current clinical work is with the Forensic Mental Health Network, Consultant to the NSW Police State Protection Group, and private medicolegal practice. He is co-academic program director for the Forensic Mental Health program at UNSW.

Lee Knight is a trained Clinical Nurse Consultant (CNC) who specialises in the field of forensic psychiatry. Lee is currently employed as the Clinical Coordinator of a large randomised control study conducted by the University of New South Wales (UNSW). Lee is also a conjoint lecturer at UNSW, teaching Criminal and Disordered Sexual Behaviour on the Master of Forensic Mental Health Program.

Professor Dan Howard SC is a Conjoint Associate Professor in the School of Psychiatry, UNSW Australia and Professorial Fellow at the University of Wollongong Faculty of Law. He has been practising law for over 30 years. He has been a Member of the NSW Mental Health Review Tribunal since 2008 and has been President of the Tribunal since June 2012. He is an Acting Judge of the District Court of NSW.
